1 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
2 conditions and limitations:

3 (1) The appropriations will be allocated by the office of financial
4 management to agencies to resolve year 2000 issues. Agencies shall
5 submit their estimated costs to resolve year 2000 issues to the office
6 of financial management.

7 (2) To facilitate the transfer of moneys from dedicated funds and
8 accounts, the state treasurer is directed to transfer sufficient moneys
9 from each dedicated fund or account to the year 2000 contingency
10 revolving account, in accordance with schedules provided by the office
11 of financial management.

12 **Sec. 710.** 1999 c 309 s 714 (uncodified) is amended to read as
13 follows:

14 **FOR THE GOVERNOR--EXTRAORDINARY CRIMINAL JUSTICE COSTS.**

15 ~~((\$1,200,000))~~ (1) \$510,000 of the public safety and education account,
16 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated solely for
17 providing financial assistance in the 1999-01 biennium to Okanogan
18 county for extraordinary criminal justice costs incurred in the
19 adjudication of an aggravated homicide case. The office of financial
20 management, in consultation with Okanogan county, shall determine the
21 amount to be paid based on an assessment of the portion of the costs
22 associated with the homicide case which is disproportionate relative to
23 the county's criminal justice resources. The amount paid under this
24 section shall not exceed eighty percent of the total costs associated
25 with the investigation, prosecution, indigent defense, jury
26 impanelment, expert witness, interpreters, incarceration, and other
27 adjudication costs of the case. On January 1, 2000, any unexpended
28 funds of the amount appropriated in this section shall lapse and revert
29 to the public safety and education account.

30 (2) \$550,000 of the public safety and education account, or so much
31 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated solely for providing
32 financial assistance in the 1999-01 biennium to Franklin, Cowlitz, and
33 Thurston counties for extraordinary criminal justice costs incurred in
34 the adjudication of aggravated homicide cases. Within the amount
35 appropriated in this subsection, the office of financial management, in
36 consultation with the counties, shall determine the amount to be paid
37 based on an assessment of the portion of the costs associated with the
38 homicide case which is disproportionate relative to the county's

1 criminal justice resources. The amount paid under this section shall
2 not exceed eighty percent of the total costs associated with the
3 investigation, prosecution, indigent defense, jury impanelment, expert
4 witness, interpreters, incarceration, and other adjudication costs of
5 the cases. On January 1, 2001, any unexpended funds of the amount
6 appropriated in this subsection shall lapse and revert to the public
7 safety and education account.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 711.** A new section is added to 1999 c 309
9 (uncodified) to read as follows:

10 **FOR THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT--DIGITAL GOVERNMENT POOL**

11 Data Processing Revolving Account Appropriation	\$	4,000,000
12 Master Licensing Account Appropriation	\$	1,000,000
13 Digital Government Revolving Account	\$	5,000,000
14 TOTAL APPROPRIATION	\$	10,000,000

15 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
16 conditions and limitations:

17 (1) The data processing revolving account appropriation and the
18 digital government revolving account appropriation are provided solely
19 to provide digital services of government to citizens, businesses, and
20 to state and other governments. The office of financial management, in
21 consultation with the department of information services, shall
22 allocate these funds as needed for digital government projects.

23 (2) The master licensing account appropriation is provided solely
24 to support systems to enable businesses to file their master business
25 licenses electronically and to enable corporations and companies to
26 file reports electronically.

27 (3) To facilitate the transfer of moneys from dedicated funds and
28 accounts, the state treasurer is directed to transfer sufficient moneys
29 from each dedicated fund or account to the digital government revolving
30 account, hereby created in the state treasury, in accordance with
31 schedules provided by the office of financial management for additional
32 digital government projects.

33 (4) Agencies receiving these allocations shall report at a minimum
34 to the information services board and to the office of financial
35 management on the progress of digital government projects and efforts.
