To promote justice, protect due process, and ensure constitutional and statutory rights to effective counsel, OPD asks the Legislature to fund the following:

- Order #25700-B-732 increases OPD's cost to purchase case transcripts \$496K *OPD must obtain trial transcripts in order to prepare appeals for indigent clients.*
- Order #25700-A-1656 updates caseload standards for dependencies \$6.16M *Full-time attorney contracts can't exceed 45 clients in FY 27 and 35 clients in FY 28.*
- Placeholder for updated caseload standards for indigent appeals \$TBD Final Court Order limiting appellate caseload is anticipated by the end of the calendar year.

Make Technical Adjustments

- Correct drafting error to align base appropriation and proviso obligations \$0

 Budget chairs identified this error and asked OPD to submit a correction, net \$0 appropriation change.
- Streamline authority to accept re-occurring grant from a private funder *OPD receives an annual ABA grant to participate in the national Family Justice Initiative.*

Maintain Right-to-Counsel Services

Blake response and Simple Possession Advocacy Representation (SPAR) \$1.9M
 Partial restoration of 2025-27 funding cuts will support ongoing vacatur of unconstitutional felony convictions and will help ensure counsel is available for new misdemeanor drug charges.

Respond to
State v. Lewis

• Provide counsel for persons eligible to be resentenced under new case law \$100K *The Supreme Court has determined that criminal history may not include foreign convictions.*
